Each discussion topic will be worth a total of 10 points (5 topics - 50 points).

Late turn in of the Midterm Exam or Final Exam will result in a 20% per day deduction in points. (i.e., if you scored 89 out of 100 points on the Midterm, but you were 1 day late, instead of an 89%, your grade would be: 89 - (89 x 20%)/100 = 71.2%). Early submission of work is accepted and encouraged.
