How are graduation rates calculated?



The official graduation rate for community colleges, which measures completion of the first-time, full-time, degree-seeking cohort for 150% of "normal time."



Why do graduation rates matter?



The average graduation rate for community colleges in the nation is 36%



Who is not included?

- Part-time students
- Stop-outs
- Spring starters

567 first-time, full-time

133 graduated within "normal time"



Graduation Rate 2016 Cohort*



133 out of 567 first-time, fulltime students who entered college in 2016 graduated within the "normal time" frame



Equitable COMPLETION



Would more students from the class of 2016 have graduated within 150% of "normal time" if finances were less of a barrier?





Equitable ACCESS

Will increasing the college-going rate in the region, also increase the graduation rate?

(5 year average is 48.2%)





Equitable CAREER

Will increased graduation rates increase the number of students who transfer or who are placed in high-demand, high-wage careers?

Eligibility

High school seniors who live in the Odessa College **Service Area** and are graduating in the **Class of 2024**

GED and home school students must be between the ages of 17-19 after 2024

No income or high school GPA requirement

Eligible students **must enroll full-time** in an associate degree or workforce certificate pathway.



To maintain eligibility once the scholarship is awarded, student must be enrolled full-time and maintain at least 12 credit hours with satisfactory academic progress (2.0 GPA), as well as meet minimum cocurricular engagement and community service requirements.
