

## **ACCELERATED INTENSIVE PROGRAM DESCRIPTION**

Teaching Emphasis: Odessa College: AAT degree in Teaching Early Childhood to 6th (1.5 years)

UTPB: BA Multidisciplinary Studies EC-6th (1.5 years)

Delivery Options:

Online, Morning, Evening and Weekend Options

Students will typically take three classes each 8 weeks

Faculty: First 1 ½ years will be taught solely by Odessa College faculty members. The final 1 ½ years

will be taught by UTPB faculty, OC faculty, and ISD administrators. These will be specialized sections specific to the cohort. The sections will be project-based, problem-based, case-study courses based on the AVID model. Instructors will model the type of teaching and learning

that the aspiring teachers will lead in their own classrooms.

Role of ISDs: OC and UTPB will partner with ISDs in the area to incentivize involvement of their staff in the

program. They will also gain access to prospective employees.

Clinical Hours: Students will be required through their courses to serve sixteen hours each semester. ISD staff

members will be exempt from these hours.

Location of courses: All courses will take place on the Odessa College campus, including those offered through UTPB.

Courses will be face-to-face in Odessa and delivered via satellite to the rest of the service area.

We will partner with ISDs for a physical space in the extension areas.

Capstone Project: Portfolio; throughout the program, instructors will work together to create a series of

meaningful, relevant projects that will go into the portfolio. The portfolio will be

assembled for interview purposes.

Design of program plan: All courses will be cohort based. (Spring & Fall cohorts only) Students will start together at

Odessa College and transfer together to UTPB. All students required to apply to the program.

Applications are accepted on a rolling basis.

Professional Development: The summer before they begin their first year of teaching, graduates of the program will

undergo a series of free professional development workshops, including classroom discipline, content specialization, AVID strategies, project-based learning, Montessori, Gifted

and Talented, and ESL.

Advisory Committee: OC and UTPB Faculty members, ISD superintendents and administrators, a member of the

Permian Basin Workforce Development Board, and a person from Region 18 will be a part of the

advisory committee.
