Grading Policy

Each week, I will provide grades or scores and comments on assignments within 6 days of when they were submitted. After I send feedback each week, I will post a notification in the **Main** forum.

Late assignments receive a 10% deduction for each day they are late if assignments are not posted by 11:59 p.m. central on the day they are due. Assignments more than 5 days late will not be accepted. Technological issues will not be considered as valid grounds for late assignment submission. In the event of a server outage, students should submit assignments to the instructor.

The Basic Firefighter Academy is divided into 7 sections: Firefighter Certification I, II, III, IV, V, VI, and VII. In order to successfully complete this course, the student must receive a minimum passing score of 70% on every assignment, chapter test, Fire Learn test, HazMat assignment, and skills session; as well as receive a minimum passing score of 80% on every weekly test, Mid-Term, Final, and Final Comprehensive tests. Although individual grades are updated weekly, the final grade for this course will be determined on the percentages listed below:

- 5% Discussion Board
- 5% Blackboard Chapter Tests
- 5% Handout Assignments
- 5% Fire Learn Chapter Tests
- 10% Weekly Chapter Tests
- 20% Skills Sessions
- 15% Mid-Term Test
- 15% Final Test
