Course description: Includes sets, complex numbers, quadratic and quadratic form equations, inequalities, functions, systems of equations and topics selected from exponential and logarithmic functions, matrices, determinants, binomial theorem, math induction and sequences and series. The student will learn to select appropriate mathematical techniques and technologies and use skills in information organizing, processing, planning and problem solving. The student should be able to probe for mathematical meaning and, perhaps, describe these meanings to others. Placement testing available. (SCANS 3, 8, 9, 11)

Learning outcomes:

After completing this course, the student should be able to demonstrate competency in:

- 1.0 Functions and graphs
- 2.0 Polynomials and rational functions
- 3.0 Exponential and logarithmic functions
- 4.0 Systems of equations and matrices
- 5.0 Other topics in algebra

Tutoring: OC offers free tutoring in math in ET 120. There is no lab requirement for this course.

Attendance: If you have a perfect attendance record, I will add five points to your final average. For each class, one less point will be added. After five absences, I will subtract one point for each absence. There are no excused absences. To be counted present, you must arrive on time and stay for the entire period.

Homework: homework will be assigned and taken up daily. Homework will be due at the beginning of the class period. Late homework receives half credit. No work will be accepted more than 7 days late. Your homework average will be 20% of your grade.

Special project: a special project will be required during the semester. I will provide information on this later.

Determination of course average: at the end of the semester (before the final) you will have four exam grades. I will drop the lowest of the four exam grades, then add your final exam grade, and your homework average. Each exam will be 20% of your grade, and the final exam will be 20% of your grade.
