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Course Description

Presents rules of the sport while instructing individuals on the fundamentals of all rodeo events, both men's and women's individual and team. The class teaches individuals how to contribute to a group effort while encouraging individuals to excel in one specialized rodeo area. Participants are taught how to recognize and solve specific rodeo event problems. Students are also encouraged to set individual and team goals and exert effort necessary to accomplish those goals. Lab fee required.

Course Objectives

Learning Outcomes:

Upon completing this course, the student will be able to demonstrate competencies in the following:

1. Exhibit knowledge of the rules for their college rodeo event;

2. Understand the basic skills needed to be competitive in each event;
3. Recognize and solve specific problems related to each event;
4. Contribute to group or team effort.

Class Activities:

1. Bareback Bronc Riding
2. Calf Roping
3. Breakaway Roping (women)
4. Saddle Bronc Riding
5. Goat Tying (women)
6. Team Roping (co-ed)
7. Barrel Racing (women)
8. Bull Riding
9. Steer Wrestling

Timeline:

Two weeks are needed for each of the events with the exception of the team roping and the barrel race which each require one week. Week one of the two-week events is used for reviewing rules, infractions, demonstrations, and techniques. Week two is used for student participation on livestock and/or simulators.

Class Participation:

1. Students will observe demonstration(s) by rodeo athletes in each event and take part in discussion of rules for each event.
2. Students will perform the basic skills necessary to compete in each event using real livestock and/or simulators.
3. Students will be able to recognize the techniques necessary to excel in each event.

Grading Policy

Each week, I will provide grades or scores and comments on assignments within 6 days of when they were submitted. After I send feedback each week, I will post a notification in the Main forum.

Late assignments receive a 10% deduction for each day they are late if assignments are not posted by 11:59 p.m. central on the day they are due. Assignments more than 5 days late will not be accepted. Technological issues will not be considered as valid grounds for late assignment submission. In the event of a server outage, students should submit assignments to the instructor.
