### Course Description

An intermediate type of health-related professions work-based learning experience that enables the student to apply specialized occupational theory, skills, and concepts. As outlined in the learning plan, apply the theory, concepts, and skills involving specialized materials, tools, equipment, procedures, and legal systems associated with the occupation and the business/industry and will demonstrate legal and ethical behavior, safety practices, interpersonal and teamwork skills, and appropriate written and verbal communication skills using the terminology of the occupation and the business/industry. Intermediate clinical instruction that helps students synthesize new knowledge, apply previous knowledge, or gain experience managing the workflow. Practical experience is simultaneously related to theory. Close and/or direct supervision is provided by the clinical professional (faculty or preceptor), generally in a clinical setting. Clinical education is an unpaid learning experience. (ICOs 1,2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11) Prerequisite VNSG 1361, VNSG 1406, VNSG 1407 and VNSG 1509. Corequisites: VNSG 1219, VNSG 1238, and VNSG 1510.

### Course objectives

1. Function within the nurse's legal scope of practice and in accordance with the policies and procedures of the health care institution or practice setting.
2. Assume responsibility and accountability for the quality of nursing care provided to Patients and their families.

3. Contribute to activities that promote the development and practice of vocational nursing.
- 4 Use clinical reasoning and established evidence-based policies as the basis for decision making in nursing practice.
- 5 Assist in determining the physical and mental health status, needs, and preferences of culturally, ethnically, and socially diverse patients and their families based on interpretation of health-related data.
6. Report data to assist in the identification of problems and formulation of goals/ outcomes and patient-centered plans of care in collaboration with patients, their families, and the interdisciplinary health care team.
7. Provide safe, compassionate, basic nursing care to assigned patients with predictable health care needs through a supervised, directed scope of practice.
8. Implement aspects of the plan of care within legal, ethical, and regulatory parameters and in consideration of patient factors.
9. Identify and report alterations in patient responses to therapeutic interventions in Comparison to expected outcomes.
10. Implement teaching plans for patients and their families with common health problems and well defined health learning needs.
11. Assist in the coordination of human, information, and materiel resources in providing Care for assigned patients and their families.
12. Demonstrate knowledge of the Texas Nursing Practice Act and the Texas Board of Nursing Rules that emphasize safety, as well as all federal, state, and local government and accreditation organization safety requirements and standards.
13. Implement measures to promote quality and a safe environment for patients, self, and others.
14. Assist in the formulation of goals and outcomes to reduce patient risks.
15. Obtain instruction, supervision, or training as needed when implementing nursing Procedures or practices.
16. Communicate and collaborate with patients, their families, and the interdisciplinary Health care team to assist in the planning, delivery, and coordination of patient-centered care to assigned patients.
17. Participate as an advocate in activities that focus on improving the health care of patients and their families.
- 18 Participate in the identification of patient needs for referral to resources that facilitate continuity of care, and ensure confidentiality.
19. Communicate and collaborate in a timely manner with members of the Interdisciplinary health care team to promote and maintain optimal health status of patients and their families.
20. Communicate patient data using technology to support decision making to improve Patient care.
