Course Objective: This survey course in Texas government is designed to provide the student with a working knowledge of Texas government. This knowledge will enable the student to become a better informed and participating citizen of our state and the nation. The course is designed to provide the student with the opportunity to earn college credit for a course in Texas government when circumstances prevent the student from attending a more traditional Odessa College class.

Course Requirements: The student will complete the following:

1. Four (4) unit exams

Deadlines for the submission of the three areas listed above will be established by the professor. All exams will be taken on the Odessa College campus at a time and place arranged by the professor. If a student, without making prior arrangements with the professor, fails to take the unit examinations by the established date; the course grade of (F) is automatically given.

Grading: The student will have (4) exams. As professor I will double the highest exam grade of each individual student. The exams will then be added together and the total sum will be divided by (5). This will give me the student's course average. From the course average I will determine the final course grade.

Grading Scale: A 100-90; B 89-80; C 79-70; D 69-60; F 59-Below
