## **Course Description:**

Students will develop and/or enhance their music reading and listening skills through practice and performance on their instrument. Sophomore Class Piano (2114.F50C) is a course for music majors designed to present musical knowledge as applied to the keyboard and to further develop basic skills related to playing the piano. Fundamental keyboard skills will include sightreading, transposition, scales, chords, harmonization, arpeggios, ensemble playing and interpretation and performance of solo repertoire.

## **Course Student Learning Outcomes:**

1. Students will identify the right hand fingering for a I IV I V7 I cadence in every key.
2. Student will play the I IV I V7 I cadence in every key, hands together.
3. Students will learn fingering for all major scales, hands together, 2 octaves.
4. Students will learn fingering for all minor scales, hands together, 2 octaves.
5. Students will learn fingering for all major and minor arpeggios, hands together, 2 octaves.
6. Students will be exposed to a variety of piano repertoire.
7. Students will cultivate musical expression.
8. Students will display critical thinking and listening skills through oral critiques of performances concerning artistic expression, performance practice, and a selection of repertoire.

### **Course Prerequisites:**

Freshman Class Piano MUSI 1114.F50C and Freshman Class Piano MUSI 1115.F50C

### **Course Topics:**

Learn and polish at least 2 contrasting musical works.

Perform on recital (optional).

Learn how to strengthen piano technique.

Will study scales (2 octaves), chords and arpeggios in all keys.
