COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course builds on the concepts of previous nursing courses with emphasis on utilizing the Nursing Process in dealing with Maternity and Newborn health. This is a study of biological, psychological, and sociological concepts applicable to the basic needs of the family including childbearing and neonatal care. Topics include physiological changes related to pregnancy, fetal development, and nursing care of the family during labor and delivery and the puerperium.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

1. The student will discuss human reproduction and fetal development as related to the normal aspects of childbearing
2. The student will identify common complications of the mother and newborn during prenatal, antenatal, and postnatal periods Implement measures to promote quality and safe environments for patients, self and others.
3. The student will demonstrate appropriate written and verbal communication skills using the terminology of the occupation and the business/industry.
4. The student will relate characteristics of the normal newborn and associated nursing interventions to meet identified to meet identified health care needs utilizing the nursing process
5. The student will identify the legal parameters of Vocational Nursing Practice and healthcare in the area of Maternal Newborn Nursing

The official Skills Content Mastery will be given in May. In addition to the 10% weight that it will carry in the final grade, you will be required to score a "Level 2" per the calculated ATI grading system to proceed to the third semester.</p>

Any ATI content Mastery Exams assigned will be graded as follows:

Level 3 = 80 + 20 points for completion of remediation = 100 points

Level 2 = 70 + 20 points for completion of remediation = 90 points

Level 1 = 55 + 20 points for completion of remediation = 75 points

< Level 1 = 40 + 20 points for completion of remediation = 60 points

A minimum of 90% probability of passing NCLEX-PN on the first attempt is considered passing for the ATI Comprehensive Exam.
